

ADVERBS OF MANNER

Adverbs of manner describe how things happen.

They are usually formed by adding **-ly** at the end of the adjectives.

Sometimes there are **changes in spelling**:

easy → easily gentle → gently

If the adjective ends in **-ly** we use the phrase **in a ... way**:

friendly → in a friendly way

silly → in a silly way

Some adverbs have the **same form** as the adjective:

hard late fast early much little straight


