The settlers accepted the Indians' help. Then (), however,
the settlers took whatever else they wanted by force. In 1622, the
local Indians attacked the settlers for interfering with ()
Indian land. Three hundred forty settlers died. The colonists
answered the attack by destroying the Indian () tribes
living along Virginia's coast.
The settlers recognized that they would have to grow their
) own food and survive on their own without (
help from England or anyone else. The Jamestown colony was clearly
established by 1624. It was () even beginning to earn
money by () growing and selling a new crop, tobacco

The other early English settlements in North America were much to the
north of Virginia, in the present () state of
Massachusetts. The people who settled there left England for different
reasons than those who () settled in
Jamestown. The Virginia settlers were looking () for ways
to earn money for English () businesses. The settlers in
) Massachusetts were seeking religious freedom.

King Henry () the Eighth of England had separated from the
Roman Catholic Church. His () daughter, Queen Elizabeth,
established the Protestant religion in England. It () was
called the Church of England, or the Anglican Church. The Anglican
Church, however (), was similar to that of the Roman
Catholic Church.
Not all Protestants liked this. Some wanted to leave the Anglican
Church and () form religious () groups of their
own. In 1606, members of () one such group in the town of
Scrooby did separate from the Anglican Church. About one hundred
twenty-five people left England for () Holland. They
found problems there too, so they decided to move
againto the New World.
