- B** After three centuries of hunting, water pollution is today one of the biggest problems for whales. Although it's difficult to tell how many are in the ocean, current evidence suggests that more species are going to become extinct soon.
- C** In recent years, the populations of certain species of snakes have mysteriously declined by at least 50% across the UK, France, and Italy. Unfortunately, scientists aren't sure if this will improve.
- D** This particular monkey lives in the forests of the Peruvian Andes. With the continuing destruction of forests in the area, scientists predict that its population is going to fall by 80% over three generations. Experts hope that local industries will protect these animals.
