

## ADJECTIVES ENDING IN -ED OR -ING

An **adjective** that ends in **-ING** is used to describe: the characteristic of a person, a thing or a situation.

An **adjective** that ends in **-ED** is used to describe: a feeling (or how a person feels) or an emotion. It is used to describe a temporary thing.

**Un adjetivo que termina en -ING se usa para describir:** características de una persona, una cosa o una situación.

**Un adjetivo que termina en -ED se usa para describir:** un sentimiento (o cómo se siente una persona) o una emoción. Se usa para describir algo temporal.






