**CHARLES ROBERT DARWIN**

- A.** Charles Robert Darwin was born in Shrewsbury on the 12<sup>th</sup> of February, 1809. His mother died when he was eight, so he was brought up by his sister and his father Robert, who was a doctor. Charles later said that he greatly loved his father, but most people found Dr Robert (as he was called) hard to get along with and a bit scary. Dr Robert was so large and so strict that people usually fell silent when he came into the room.
- B.** Charles went to school in Shrewsbury, but he hated it! He didn't pay attention in class, he copied from his fellow pupils and he forgot everything he had learned after a day or two. His school was really an awful place. Boys were beaten for not doing their homework or for getting bad marks on tests! There were no toilets or bathrooms in the building, and all the boys had to use chamber pots as toilets. These were kept under their beds even when they were full.
- C.** When he was 16, Charles went to Edinburgh University to study medicine. His father wanted him to become a doctor, but Charles didn't like medicine. He found the lectures dull; he hated the operations he had to watch — he was sick at the sight of blood. Charles didn't quite dare tell his father how much he hated medicine, but he got his sister to do it for him. His unhappy father said that he could become a clergyman instead, if he liked.
- D.** Once a friend invited him on a scientific expedition on his ship called *the Beagle*. Charles really wanted to go, but he wasn't sure that his father would approve. And he was quite right. However, his dad said, 'If you can find any man of common sense who advises you to go, I'll let you go'. Charles's uncle agreed to help and talked his father into the idea. And so, without any clear idea about what he wanted to do with his life Charles went on a scientific expedition.
- E.** It was a 5-year expedition to unknown places. Although Charles wasn't actually a scientist and he was terribly seasick, he had a wonderful time on his voyage. When *the Beagle* arrived at the Cape Verde Islands, Charles set foot in a tropical forest for the first time. And he was amazed by the huge variety of animals and plants. He started to collect like crazy — butterflies, spiders, beetles, shells — he loved everything.
- F.** In 1835, *the Beagle* landed at the Galapagos Islands where Charles saw giant tortoises and other interesting creatures. Charles found that each of the islands had its *own* variety of tortoise and finch. The animals on different islands were a little bit different. It seemed very strange to Charles. According to the accepted view at the time, all animal species were created by God for ever. So, God must have designed slightly different animals for each island...

'But Tara may take a message to the hut,' he said. 'Come here, old fellow! I want you to play postman for me.'

Maurice found a card in his pocket. No pencil! He could do without it.

He broke a thorn off the closest bush and wrote something with the blood of a coyote. Then he tied the card to the neck of the dog and made it go to the hut.

After a while the mustanger was surrounded by the coyotes again.

Maurice got out of the hammock and reached the stream. He once more looked around him and felt danger. He noticed the spotted yellow skin among the leaves. It was the jaguar.
