 When we compare three or more nouns: **superlative**.

Very short words (one syllable) → + ER → + EST	Tall Small Old	Taller Smaller Older	Tallest Smallest Oldest
Short words (two syllables): Ending in -y, -ow, -er, -le → + ER → + EST	Heavy Clever Narrow	Heavier Cleverer Narrower	Heaviest Cleverest Narrowest
Short words (two syllables): NOT ending in -y, -ow, -er, -le → MORE → MOST	Tired Awful Famous	More tired More awful More famous	Most tired Most awful Most famous
Long words (three or more syllables) → MORE → MOST	Beautiful Expensive Horrible	More beautiful More expensive More horrible	Most beautiful Most expensive Most horrible

Ending in consonant after short vowel:	Big	Bigger	Biggest
Ending in -e:	Large	Larger	Largest
Ending in consonant + y:	Happy	Happier	Happiest
Ending in vowel + Y:	Grey	Greyer	Greyest

Structure.

Compare 2 things, who are the same → positive degree

Example: This ball is **as big as** the other ball.

Compare two things with each other → comparative degree

Example: This ball is **bigger than** the other ball.

Compare 3 or more things → superlative degree.

Example: This ball is **the biggest of** them all.

Russia is **the biggest** country **in** the World.



Bart is young



Lisa is younger



Maggie is the youngest.
