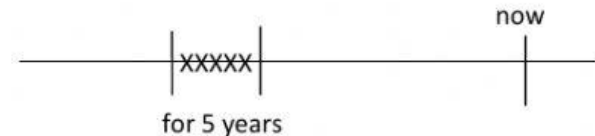
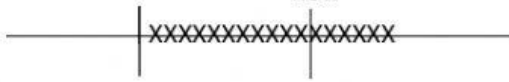

He <u>has visited</u> New York. <u>Has she left</u> the office? 
Completed action in the past that is not true now. How long <u>did you live</u> in Boston? I <u>lived</u> in Boston for 5 years. (now I live in Italy) She <u>studied</u> English for 3 years. 	An action that started in the past but continues in the present, it is also true now. (often using "for/since") How long <u>has she lived</u> in Florence? She <u>has lived</u> in Florence for 3 years. They <u>have worked</u> here since 2010 I <u>have played</u> football since I was a child. 
Repeated action in the past, and not possible in the future. Shakespeare <u>wrote</u> many books My father is retired, he <u>had</u> many different jobs. 	Repeated action in the past, but possible in the future. John Grisham <u>has written</u> many books I <u>have had</u> many jobs. How many times <u>have you seen</u> that film? I've <u>seen</u> it 3 times
