

### The Simple Past Tense

When talking about an activity that has already happened or is in the Past, we use the Past Tense.

For a one-syllable verb ending with a single consonant, **double the final letter** before adding **ed**, when a single vowel comes before the last consonant.

For example: The bunny **hopped** away. (hop)
