Topic: Future forms.

Use **Be going to** for

- future plans

I'm **going to** wash the car today.

- intentions

We're **going to** eat outside.

- predictions based on present evidence

Look at that boy. He's **going to** fall off the ladder.

Perhaps your sister **-----** accompany to the doctor?

----- Jessie be back soon? I need to talk to her.

I hope I **-----** be happy when I grow up.

I **-----** spend the money I've been saving for the last five months on a new laptop.

I **-----** eat more sweets before dinner. I promise.

Mum has bought eggs, flour and fruit. She **-----** bake a cake.

Next year my sister **-----** learn how to drive a car.

We **-----** meet our cousins tonight.

----- you lend me a biro? I've got nothing to write with.

I **-----** call Liz as soon as I'm back.

Your T-shirt has a stain. **-----** (you) wash it?

Diana **-----** wash her hair this afternoon.

I think people **-----** speak one language someday.

We **-----** probably go mountaineering next summer.

There are no clouds in the sky. It **-----** be a beautiful day.

Don't worry mum. I **-----** pick Tommy up from school today.

Use **Will** for

- predictions

There **will** be no diseases in the future.

- promises

I **won't** tell anyone. You can trust me.

- on-the-spot decisions

'I'm thirsty.' I **will** buy you a Coke.'



George **-----** probably go to the concert.

I'm afraid Helen **-----** pass her final exam because she didn't study hard enough.

Steve is tired. He **-----** take a short nap.

Look! Pam **-----** jump into the swimming pool.
