# short adjectives

- ★ one-syllable adjectives take **-est**  
short – the short , fast – the fast
- ★ one-syllable adjectives ending in **-e** take **-st**  
nice – the nice , late – the late
- ★ one-syllable adjectives ending in consonant, vowel, consonant, **double the last consonant** and take **-est**  
fat – the fat , hot – the hot
- ★ two-syllable adjectives ending in consonant **-y** take **-est**, **-y** changes to **-i**  
nasty – the nast , easy – the eas
- ★ irregular forms  
good – the , bad – the ,  
far – the /

# long adjectives

- ★ two-syllable adjectives not ending in **-y** and three or more-syllable adjectives use **most**  
modern – the modern  
dangerous – the dangerous
- ★ with some two-syllable adjectives, we can use **-est** or **most**  
clever – the clever / the clever  
narrow – the narrow / the narrow  
simple – the simple / the simple
