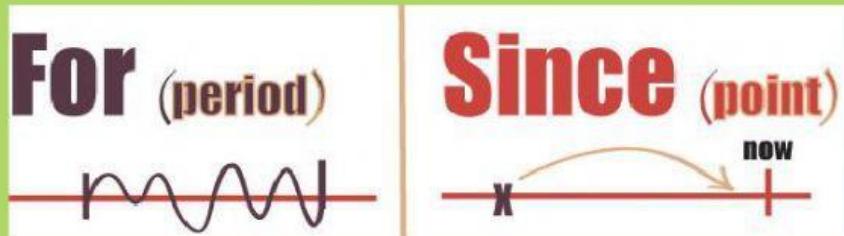


For or Since?

❖ We often use "for" and "since" when talking about time.

"FOR" is used to talk about a period of time. (for example: for three years)

"SINCE" is used to talk about a point in time (for example: since 1997)
