- We use adverbs of frequency to say how often somebody does something.

always		They always play computer games.
usually		I usually go to a friend's house.
often		We often go to the park.
sometimes		We sometimes listen to music.
never		You never read books.
- Adverbs of frequency usually go before the main verb.

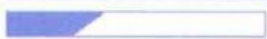
She doesn't **always** go to bed early.

Do you **usually** go to the park?
- sometimes* and *often* have a different place in a negative sentence.

Sometimes they don't play basketball.

They don't visit their aunt **often**.
