

Remembrance Sunday

Armistice Day is on the eleventh of November. It marks the day that the First World War ended. Remembrance Sunday is on the second Sunday in November. On Remembrance Sunday we remember the people who died in wars. At eleven o'clock we hold two minutes silence. In London there is a ceremony at a place called The Cenotaph. The Queen and the Prime Minister go to the ceremony.

In the days before Remembrance Sunday a lot of people wear poppies. The poppies commemorate the people who died in wars. We use poppies because after a big battle in World War One poppies grew in the field where soldiers had been fighting.
