BETHANYHAMILTON - SOULSURFER						
Bethany Hamilton was definitely born with the sea in her blood. Her parents, who were enthusiastic surfers, had moved to Hawaii before she was born so that they could spend more time in the water. With her parents and two older brothers, she started learning to surf almost as soon as she could walk. (1) So, it was no surprise when, on the night before Halloween in 2003, she went for an evening's surfing with her friends. The waves weren't very high and she was just lying on her board, relaxing, when a three-metre-long tiger shark came up from below and bit off her left arm.  Thanks to her quick-thinking friends, Bethany survived despite losing a large amount of blood. (2) When she came to after the operation, her first words were 'When can I surf again?' She didn't have to wait long. On November 26th, she returned to the sea on her surfboard and, in January 2004, she entered her first competition since the attack.  Around the same time as she was returning to surfing competitions, Bethany was also busy with						
appearances on television and in newspaper interviews. (3) She was a modest person by nature, and didn't enjoy all the attention. But, eventually, she realised that it gave her an opportunity to tell people about her life and her beliefs.
