



PAST TENSES:

A quick tip: We use **past simple** tense for referring to a completed action in the past; **past continuous** tense for referring to a continuous action going on at a specific time in the past; **past perfect** tense for referring to an action which happened before another past action; **past perfect continuous** to emphasise the continuation of an action that was in progress before another action or time in the past; **used to** for repeated actions, habits and routines in the past. They are often no longer as so.
