Introduces a second action	Two sentences in the same sentence to express parallel actions.
Used in simple past clauses	Two actions happening at the same time
Interrupt on going actions	

### COMPLETE WITH **WHILE/ WHEN**.

- I was reading a book, \_\_\_\_\_ my friend arrived to my house.
- \_\_\_\_\_ the teacher began the class; some students were not in the classroom.
- I arrived to the school, \_\_\_\_\_ all my friends were making the project.
- \_\_\_\_\_ she was in high school; she traveled a lot.
- I enjoyed riding bike \_\_\_\_\_ I was a secondary school student.
- \_\_\_\_\_ Sue was taking violin lessons; she met an old friend.
- My neighbors were having a picnic \_\_\_\_\_ it started to rain.
- My sister was skating \_\_\_\_\_ I was riding bike.
- \_\_\_\_\_ I checked my Facebook the last time I had a lot of notifications.
