I/You/ We/They	I do my homework.	Do I/we/you/they do? – Yes, I do./No, I don't.	I/We/You/They do not do (do not = don't)
He/She/ It	He does his homework.	Does he/she/it do? – Yes, he does./No, he doesn't.	He/She/It does not do (does not = doesn't)
