Pronoun	Affirmative form	Interrogative form	Negative form
I/You/ We/They	I do my homework.	Do I/we/you/they do ...? – Yes, I do ./No, I don't .	I/We/You/They do not do ... (do not = don't)
He/She/ It	He does his homework.	Does he/she/it do ...? – Yes, he does ./No, he doesn't .	He/She/It does not do ... (does not = doesn't)
