

**The Present Simple Tense of the verb TO BE**

Pronoun	Affirmative form	Interrogative form	Negative form
I	I <b>am</b> at home.	<b>Am</b> I at home? – Yes, I <b>am</b> ./No, I <b>am not</b> . (No, I'm not.)	I <b>am not</b> at home. (I am not = I'm not)
You/ We/ They	You/We/They <b>are</b> at home.	<b>Are</b> we/you/they at home? – Yes, we <b>are</b> ./No, we <b>are not</b> . (No, we aren't)	We/You/They <b>are not</b> at home. (are not = aren't)
He/ She/ It	He/She/It <b>is</b> at home.	<b>Is</b> he/she/it at home? – Yes, he <b>is</b> ./No, he <b>is not</b> . (No, he isn't)	He/She/It <b>is not</b> at home. (is not = isn't)
