

THE PAST PROGRESSIVE (CONTINUOUS) TENSE

Pronouns	Affirmative sentence	Negative sentence	Interrogative sentence
I/ He/ She/ It	I was reading	I was not reading. (was not=wasn't)	Was I reading? – Yes, I was./No, I wasn't.
You/ We/ They	They were reading	They were not reading. (were not=weren't)	Were they reading? – Yes, they were./No, they weren't.

PAST CONTINUOUS (PROGRESSIVE) = PAST SIMPLE "TO BE" (WAS, WERE) + PRESENT PARTICIPLE (INFINITIVE + -ING)

PRESENT PARTICIPLE: PLAY+ING=PLAYING.

BUT:

1. ~~TAKE~~ + ING = TAKING (~~DRIVE~~=DRIVING, ~~MAKE~~=MAKING, ~~WRITE~~=WRITING, ...)
2. SWIM + ING = SWIMMING (~~PLAN~~=PLANNING, ~~TRAVEL~~=TRAVELLING, ~~RUN~~=RUNNING, SIT=SITTING, GET=GETTING, STOP=STOPPING, ...)
