Pronouns	Affirmative sentence	Negative sentence	Interrogative sentence
I/ He/ She/ It	I was reading	I was not reading. (was not=wasn't)	Was I reading? – Yes, I was,/No, I wasn't.
You/ We/ They	They were reading	They were not reading. (were not=weren't)	Were they reading? – Yes, they were./No, they weren't.

PAST CONTINUOUS (PROGRESSIVE) = PAST SIMPLE "TO BE" (WAS, WERE) + PRESENT PARTICIPLE (INFINITIVE +-ING)

PRESENT PARTICIPLE: PLAY+ING=PLAYING.

BUT:

- 1. TAKE + ING = TAKING (DRIVE=DRIVING, MAKE=MAKING, WRITE=MAKING, ...)
- 2. SWIM + ING = SWIMMING (PLAN=PLANNING, TRAVEL=TRAVELLING, RUN=RUNNING,

SIT=SITTING, GET=GETTING, STOP=STOPPING, ...)
