NOTES: Understanding the characters in a story can help you comprehend the story as a whole. As you read, you can find clues to the character's traits or personality characteristics. Some characteristics are confident; some are shy. There are several ways an author can show the traits of the characters in a story. What a character is liked can be revealed by:

1. what the character says
2. what the character does
3. what the narrator or other characters say about the characters
4. how others act toward the character.
