**1st conditional sentences**  
express true or very probable  
situation in the present or future.

if + present  
simple

future simple  
imperative  
can/may/might/  
must/should  
+ bare infinitive

**2nd conditional sentences**  
express untrue or very  
improbable situation in the  
present or future.

if + past  
simple

would/could/  
might  
+ bare infinitive
