Walking can be fun, and safe if you know what you're doing.

Walk on the sidewalk if there is one. If there is no sidewalk and you have to walk in the street, be careful. Walk close to the curb in a direction facing traffic. That way you can see what is coming toward you. Don't ever try to walk across a high-speed highway. If you walk at night, don't wear dark clothing. Wear light colored clothing so drivers can see you. Walk on well lighted paths or walkways and if possible, walk with a friend.

Here are some rules for walking near busy roads.

1. Never cross the street without looking both ways.
2. Cross the street only in a marked crosswalk.
3. Obey walk and don't walk signals.
