

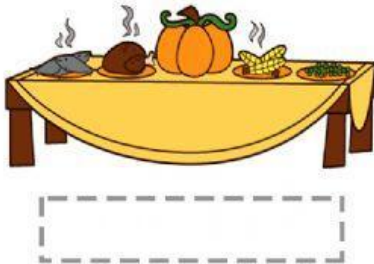
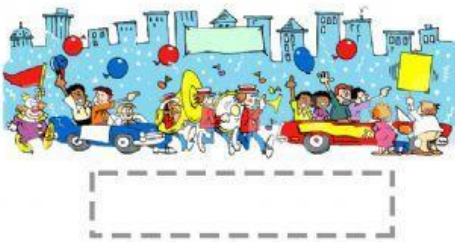
# Holidays in the USA
