#### What is simple future tense?

Simple future tense is used when talking about things that will happen at a time later than the present time. Sometimes you will hear people call future simple tense will, this is because most of the time you will use the future simple tense with the modal auxiliary will.

**Will is best used when making offers or expressing decisions.**

Mr Bean: - Who will help me paint the living room?

Mrs Bean: - Of course I will help you dear.

When using future simple tense in speaking, it's often contracted with the subject and auxiliary verb:

Examples: -

Wait, I'll get a something to eat for you.

We'll go out and have a drink tonight.

He'll be back home later

I will	I'll
you will	you'll
he will	he'll
she will	she'll
it will	it'll
we will	we'll
they will	they'll

For negative sentences in the future simple tense, we contract like: - will not = won't

Examples: -

You won't learn English if you don't try harder.

She won't be back till later.

I will not	I won't
you will not	you won't
he will not	he won't
she will not	she won't
it will not	it won't
we will not	we won't
they will not	they won't


