

All Conditionals

Zero conditional = **Simple present** + **simple present**

If you **heat** ice, it **melts**

First Conditional = **Simple present** + **simple future**

If you **drink** that milk, you **will** be sick

Second Conditional = **Simple past** + **would** + **verb**

If I **had** enough money, I **would** **go** overseas.

Third Conditional = **past perfect** + **would have** + **past participle**

If I **had won** the lottery, I **would have** gone to London.

Use the above examples to decide which conditionals the following are:

1. If we **win** a trip to Cape Town, we **will** be able to go
2. If our flight **had been** delayed, we **would have** arrived there late.
3. If we **went** by bus, it **would** be cheaper. But to go by train **would** be quicker.
4. I **am not** hungry. If I **was** hungry, I **would** eat something.
5. If I **had been** hungry, I **would have** eaten something.
6. If I **won** a lot of money, I **would** **buy** a house.
7. If they **had lost** our luggage, we **would have** had to buy more clothes.
8. If I **had seen** you, I **would have** said hello.
9. If you **want** to be fit, you **must** exercise every day.
10. If you **don't** disturb me, I **will** be able to finish this work quickly.
11. People **believe** that if they **become** rich, they **will** be happy.
12. If I **had been** sick on the flight, I **would have** called the flight attendant.
13. If you **press** that button, the machine **will** stop working.
14. If you **visit** London, you **will** see the London Eye.
15. If you **have** all the facts, you **can** make the right choice.
16. If I **had known** the boss, I **would have** got the job.
17. If they **had played** good music at the party, I **would have** danced.
18. If I **drink** coffee at night, I **don't** sleep well.
