

QUANTIFIERS.



MUCH, MANY, A LOT OF

Read the examples:

- We eat a lot of seafood
- We don't eat much fast food
- We don't eat many takeaways
- The children eat a lot of burgers



We use (how) much with uncountable nouns
We use (how) many with countable nouns
We use a lot of with countable and uncountable nouns

MUCH OR MANY

- We use much with uncountable nouns in singular and many with countable nouns in plural.
- We often use much/many in questions and negations.

We normally use a lot of/lots of in affirmative sentences.

much	much milk much money much time much water	
many	many glasses of milk many dollars many hours many bottles of water

Examples:

How much money do you have? - I don't have much left. How many dollars do you have? - I don't have many left.

- In informal English these questions are often answered with a lot of/lots of. There is no much
 difference between the two phrases.
- Note: We use much or many after as, so and too. It is wrong to use a lot of/lots with these words. (We have so a lot of homework to do.)

EXAMPLES: We have **so much** homework to do.

We have **too much** homework to do.

(A) LITTLE, (A) FEW, NO

When you want to speak about smaller quantities...

- A LITTLE: non countable nouns (milk, marmalade, money, time etc.)
- . A FEW: countable nouns (bottles of milk, jars of marmalade, dollars, minutes etc.)
- LITTLE OR FEW: mean not enough
- NO: is used in affirmative sentences to give a negative meaing

Examples:

He has a little money left. (enough)
He has a few dollars left. (enough)
Can you lend me some money? I have little money with me. (not enough money)
I need to go to the supermarket. There is few milk in the fridge. (not enough milk)
I'm afraid I have no options.
