

## CINEMA – DRAG AND DROP

<b>action</b>	a bit part played by a famous actor who would ordinarily not take such a small part	
<b>blockbuster</b>	the most important character in a movie, often distinguished by gender	
<b>cast</b>	work performed on a movie after the end of principal photography; usually involves editing and visual effects	
<b>flashback</b>	a movie that presents the characters and / or events chronologically before the setting of a previously filmed movie	
<b>out-take / goof</b>	a filmed story of a person's life story	
<b>B-movie</b>	anything an actor touches or uses on the set; e.g. phones, guns, cutlery, etc.	
<b>post-production</b>	a take of a scene not used in a movie; in some movies shown in the closing credits	
<b>stunt double</b>	a collective term for the actors appearing in a particular movie	
<b>Score</b>	the use of computer graphics to create or enhance special effects	
<b>biopic</b>	what is called during filming to indicate the start of the current take	
<b>flashforward</b>	when a movie is released for public viewing	
<b>sequel</b>	the musical component of a movie's soundtrack	
<b>release</b>	a scene that breaks the chronological continuity of the main narrative by depicting events which happened in the past	
<b>cliffhanger</b>	arrangements made before the start of filming; this can include script editing, set construction, and casting	
<b>prequel</b>	a low-budget, second tier movie	
<b>prop</b>	a movie that presents the continuation of characters and / or events of a previously filmed movie	
<b>pre-production</b>	a movie which is a huge financial success	
<b>lead role</b>	a performer who specifically takes the part of another actor for a stunt	
<b>cameo</b>	a scene that breaks the chronological continuity of the main narrative by depicting events which happen in the future	
<b>CGI</b>	a moment of high drama, frequently used at the end of series; named for the (now clichéd) practice of leaving a hero or heroine hanging onto the edge of a cliff	
<b>Set</b>	a short trailer that is generally released many months before a movie is actually released, to give a brief peek at what the movie will be like, and to build audience anticipation	
<b>teaser trailer</b>	an environment used for filming; when used in contrast to location, it refers to one artificially constructed
