GRAMMAR FOCUS

Using *present continuous* to talk about near plans

We can use present continuous to talk about something that we already decided or planned. It is used to talk about the near future.

For example:

- We are meeting Foo Fighters next month at their concert
(We are meeting them because we bought the tickets and planned the moment)
- Camilo is coming for us tomorrow morning
(We know that he is coming for us because it is previously arranged)
- I'm visiting my parents this summer.
(A holiday is usually planned with anticipation)

Using “*Going to*” to talk about the future

We use “*Going to*” to talk about something we have the intention to do in the future, but it is not organized yet.

For example:

- I'm going to exercise more next year.
(This year I was really lazy, so I have the intention to change that in the future)
- He said he is going to spend more time with his family.
(He doesn't have a good relation with them, but he wants to change it)
- We're going to get better grades for the next test.
(We got bad grades in our last test, so we want to improve)
