

Comparison of Adverbs

Input:

The comparison of adverbs is very easy. All adverbs that have the same form as the adjective they have been derived from, are compared in the same way as the adjective:

- hard, harder, hardest
- early, earlier, earliest
- late, later, latest

All other adverbs, those that end in -ly, are compared with more and most.

- highly, more highly, most highly
- extravagantly, more extravagantly, most extravagantly
- quickly, more quickly, most quickly
