BE GOING TO

We use *be going to* + verb (infinitive) to talk about future plans.

AFFIRMATIVE

I am going to have a holiday next month.

You are going to have a holiday next month.

He / She / It is going to have a holiday next month.

We are going to have a holiday next month.

You are going to have a holiday next month.

They are **going to have** a holiday next month.

NEGATIVE

I am not going to have a holiday next month.

You are not going to have a holiday next month.

He / She / It is not going to have a holiday next month.

We are not going to have a holiday next month.

You are not going to have a holiday next month.

They are not going to have a holiday next month.
