

## BE GOING TO

We use *be going to* + verb (infinitive) to talk about future plans.

### AFFIRMATIVE

I **am going to have** a holiday next month.

You **are going to have** a holiday next month.

He / She / It **is going to have** a holiday next month.

We **are going to have** a holiday next month.

You **are going to have** a holiday next month.

They **are going to have** a holiday next month.

### NEGATIVE

I **am not going to have** a holiday next month.

You **are not going to have** a holiday next month.

He / She / It **is not going to have** a holiday next month.

We **are not going to have** a holiday next month.

You **are not going to have** a holiday next month.

They **are not going to have** a holiday next month.
