It's an example of what people call the "gift economy." No money is exchanged between members, and hosts don't expect anything for their hospitality. It's also a way of seeing the "real life" of a town or city because you are staying with someone who actually lives there – a local. You're more likely to find the special places only the locals know when you're with a resident. So, if you see yourself as a "traveler" and not a "tourist," couch surfing may be for you. It's ideal for backpackers, but people of any age can enjoy it.

Couch surfing was first thought up by computer programmer Casey Fenton in 1999, when he was 25 years old. He had the idea after he found a cheap flight from Boston to Iceland but didn't have a place to stay and didn't really want to stay in a "boring" hotel. He wanted to do something more exciting. Fenton hacked into a university database and randomly emailed 1,500 students from the University of Iceland and asked if he could stay with them. He received 50 offers of accommodation.
