Conditional Sentences Revision



* Please, try to memorize the verb correspondence.

Type I - Possible

If Clause: Simple Present Main Clause: Will + verb

Ex: If she <u>has</u> money, she <u>will buy</u> a beach house.

Present S. Future

Type II - Possible but unlikely / Impossible

If Clause: Simple Past Main Clause: Would + verb

Ex: If she <u>had</u> money, she <u>would buy</u> a beach house. (<u>Impossible at present</u>)
S. Past would + verb

Ex: If I were you, I would study harder. (Impossible)

Conditional Type III - Impossible

(It is in the past, and you can't change the past)

If Clause: Past Perfect Main Clause: Would have + Past Participle

Ex: If she had had money, she would have bought a beach house.

Past Perfect would have + Past Participle
