Simple to express:

- an action that happened at a definite time in the past
- actions that happened immediately one after the other in the past

Continuous to express:

O an action that was in progress
at a stated time in the past

- two actions that were happening at the same time
- Oan action that was in progress (longer action) when another action interrupted it
