

We usually form an adverb by ADDING -LY (or -ILY) to the adjective, but some adverbs are irregular:

Fast→ fast good→ well

Hard → hard early → early

Late → late



Comparative adverbs

John drives faster than Sylvia

Sylvia drives more carefully than John
