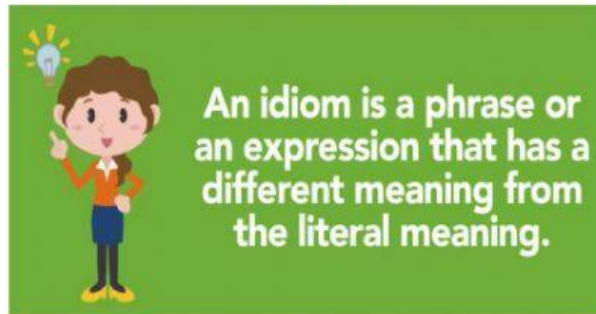


Idioms - Face & body parts-2
