After one of the most p_____ ¹ (**causing something to divide into two groups with completely different points of view**) and drawn-out presidential elections in U.S. history, the race was called for Democrat Joe Biden on Saturday – despite pending lawsuits from Republican i_____ ² (**the person who currently holds an official position**) Donald Trump. Voters ultimately embraced Biden's promise of a renewed effort to combat the coronavirus pandemic, fix the economy, and bridge America's political divide after four t_____ ³ (**full of change and confusion**) years of Trump's leadership. At 77, Biden became the oldest person ever to be elected to the nation's highest office – and won the most votes ever e_____ ⁴ (**made**) for a president. Winning the White House would be the p_____ ⁵ (**the most successful position possible to attain**) for any politician, but it's particularly special for Biden, says Reuters political correspondent James Olyphant.

"This is his 47th year in politics, he's run for president three times – he never really got out of the starting gate the first two times – so it's a lot of v_____ ⁶ (**proof that someone's action was a good idea after a long time when no one believed this**) for a guy who was counted out a zillion times, even during the 2020 campaign." Biden – who spent more than 30 years in the U.S. Senate and served as vice president under Trump's p_____ ⁷ (**the last person who occupied a position**) Barack Obama – will now look for ways to bring people together as he inherits a nation in t_____ ⁸ (**confusion and disorder**). And so, if you're looking at the fact that a 77-year-old white guy got elected president and think that the country is maybe moving backwards after we just had Donald Trump, a Vice President Harris does a lot to d_____ that n_____ ⁹ (**prove that idea wrong**). A U.S. senator from California, Harris has a track record of shattering glass ceilings. She served as San Francisco's first female district attorney and was California's first woman of color to be elected attorney general. He has promised to improve access to testing and, unlike Trump, to h_____ ¹⁰ (**pay close attention to**) the advice of leading public health officials and scientists.
