- Used for objects that are not specific or one of several things of a similar type

E.g. I need a phone.

- Used for the first time we introduce an object.

E.g. I saw a movie last night.

- Used as synonyms for the number one.

E.g. They bought a computer.

- Used to indicate one of a group.

E.g. She is a singer.

- Used before certain adjectives to give a plural meaning.
