

The Most Famous Vet in the World

One of the most famous vets in the world is James Herriot (aka Alf Wight), who was a partner in a veterinary practice in Thirsk, Yorkshire. Over the course of several years, he wrote down many stories based on his life as a country vet - some of them sad, most of them amusing, and many of them 'laugh out loud' funny! So, in addition to being a much-loved vet, Alf was also an author – and a very successful one at that. His books became famous around the world, causing his hometown of 'Thirsk', which he renamed as 'Darrowby' in his books, to become a popular tourist destination.

Alf Wight used the **pseudonym**, James Herriot because, as a practicing vet, he was **prohibited** from using any form of advertising and could have been sued for **malpractice** if he had penned his books under his own name.
