

First Conditional (Type 1)



in the future (tomorrow, etc.)	
if clause	result clause
Present Simple	will / won't
If it rains,	I will take an umbrella.
If it doesn't rain,	I will walk in the park.
If it rains,	I won't walk in the park.
If it doesn't rain,	I won't take an umbrella.

More examples:

We **will** play outdoors **if** the weather is good. (play, be)

Ice-cream **will** melt **if** you keep it in the sun. (melt, keep)

The flower **won't** grow **if** you don't water it. (not / grow, not / water)

I **will** be sad **if** she doesn't call. (be, not / call)

She **will** arrive on time **if** the bus isn't late. (arrive, not / be)
