

Phrasal Verbs: PUT

ACROSS=communicate

AWAY: return to the proper place

DOWN : insult, say bad things about

IN FOR: officially submit a request

ON: wear

OFF: postpone

OUT: -extinguish (a fire)
- inconvenience someone

UP: have a guest

PUT

UP WITH: tolerate

OUT: spend (usually large sums of money)

ONESELF OUT: make an effort

FORWARD: propose for consideration

THROUGH: connect someone by phone
