Common Phrasal Verbs

Act out

- Perform something with actions and gestures
E.g. They **acted out** the story on stage.

Act out

- Express an emotion in your behaviour
E.g. Their anger is **acted out** in their antisocial behaviour.

Back out of

Cut out

- Remove completely
E.g. He's **cut out** all the fat from his diet and he's a lot slimmer.

Draw out

- To persuade someone to express their thoughts
E.g. Can you **draw out** the plans?

Eat out
