



## FIFTH AVENUE



Misha Botnick is the director of Fifth Avenue. It's the morning after the first performance. He's speaking to the performers.

**Jason:** I'm sorry about last night, Mr. Botnick. I had one or two problems....

**Misha:** One or two! First you lost your shoe. Then you danced badly in the love scene....

**Jason:** I only had one shoe, Mr. Botnick.

**Misha:** And finally, Jason, finally... you fell into the orchestra pit.

## Revision (simple past irregular verbs)

Every day he takes a bath, so yesterday *they took a bath.*

Every morning she comes to school, so this morning *she came to school.*

Every day he takes a bath, so yesterday *he took a bath.*

Continue:

Every morning she comes to school, so this morning \_\_\_\_\_.  
Every evening they go home, so yesterday evening \_\_\_\_\_.  
Every morning he gets up, so this morning \_\_\_\_\_.  
Every Saturday he sees his mother, so last Saturday \_\_\_\_\_.  
He always eats chicken on Sundays, so last Sunday \_\_\_\_\_.  
Every night he drinks coffee, so last night \_\_\_\_\_.  
Every vacation he takes a lot of photographs, so last vacation \_\_\_\_\_.  
Every year he flies to Paris, so last year \_\_\_\_\_.  
In Bermuda the sun shines in summer, so last summer \_\_\_\_\_.

## Adjectives and Adverbs

An adjective is a word that describes a noun or a pronoun such as a person, a place, a thing or an idea.

Examples:

a good doctor. (*describing a person*)

a perfect composition. (*describing a thing*)

a beautiful beach. (*describing a place*)

a bad idea. (*describing an idea*)

An adverb of manner is an adverb that describes how and in what way the action of a verb is carried out.

Examples:

She sings beautifully.

He runs very fast.

I studied hard yesterday.

She dances badly.

### Forming Adverbs of Manner

Adjective	Adverb	What changes?
beautiful	beautifully	Adjective + LY
slow	slowly	
bad	badly	
happy	happily	Adjectives that finish in -Y change -Y by -I and add LY
noisy	noisily	
easy	easily	
good	well	Irregular forms
hard	hard	
fast	fast
