

Cause and Effect (1)

With Caroline the Carrot

Hi! I am Caroline the Carrot. Let's learn the difference between a *cause* and an *effect* together. A *cause* is the reason why something happens. An *effect* is what happens. Here is an example:

Because Bobby watered the garden daily,
(cause)
the vegetables grew beautifully.
(effect)
