Future Perfect

will have + past participle

This is what these people do every Friday at 4 pm:

John **plays** football at the club.

Mary **visits** her grandparents.

Andy **works** at the office.

Sammy **does** her homework.

Chris **plays** videogames in his room.

Tomorrow is a Friday so at 4 pm:

John football at the club.

Mary her grandparents.

Andy at the office.

Sammy her homework.

Chris videogames in his room.

John usually **leaves** the club at 6 pm.

By 6.30 he the club.

Mary **goes** home at about 7.

By 7.30 she home.

Andy **finishes** work at 5.30.

By 6 o'clock he work.

It takes Sammy two hours to **do** her homework.

By 6.30 she her homework.

Chris usually **turns off** his game console at 5.30.

By 6 o'clock he his game console.
