

inclined	wanting to do something	I felt inclined to trust him
stormy	Bad mood. Full of angry or violent outbursts.	John was in such a stormy mood that he scolded anyone who crossed him.
wolfed down	to eat something very quickly especially if you are in a rush	I wolfed down my breakfast and ran to school.
gnawing	uncomfortable, worrying or painful	The pain in her tooth was gnawing at her.

Climax - Paragraph 3

Objective -

Build tension by slowing down action

Describe everything in detail. Show feelings and personal thoughts.

1. Show anticipation - Clickbait - but don't tell what the problem is yet!

E.g Just then, the unimaginable happened!

or

What happened next I would never forget!

2. Now tell us what happened!

E.g I could feel an explosion in my underpants.

3. Describe everything in detail. Sight, colour and sound.

E.g An unbearable stench wafted out of me, permeating the air around. Warm brown goo exploded from my pants, staining everyone's uniforms from pristine white to brown.



4. What was everyone's reaction. Don't just tell. Show their actions!

E.g Instantly, everyone pinched their noses in unison. Their faces cringed in disgust. Some of them attempted to wave off the stench frantically.

5. What was your reaction? Show your feelings!

E.g My face turned redder than a tomato. I was burning with shame.

6. What are your personal thoughts?

E.g My classmates are going to make fun of me for an eternity. What am I going to do?
