

# Relative Pronoun



## Let's learn.

People **who** vandalise are called vandals.

The word in bold is called a relative pronoun.

**Who**, **whom**, and **which** are relative pronouns.

Examples:

1. *The man who lives in the bungalow is my uncle.*  
We use 'who' as the subject to refer to the 'man'.
2. *They hired the man whom we interviewed yesterday.*  
We use 'whom' as the object to refer to the 'man'.
3. *The car which my brother was driving last night was my father's.*  
We use 'which' as the object to refer to the 'car'.

Who or whom refers to people.  
Who comes before the verb.  
Whom comes after the first verb.
