- A.** The Sami are a group of indigenous people that come from the region of Sámi, which stretches across the northern parts of Norway, Sweden, Finland, and the Kola Peninsula in Russia. No-one is exactly sure how many Sami people there are, but estimates range from between 50,000-200,000! On the 6 February every year, they celebrate Sámi Peoples Day. They wear traditional clothes, eat traditional food and fly the Sámi flag.
- B.** Their traditional outfits - known as the Gakti - are worn at parties, festivals, weddings, funerals, and more. The handmade outfits are decorated with different designs so the Sámi can easily tell where another person is from. Traditionally, the Sámi people lived in a group of families called a 'siida'. A traditional Norwegian Sámi home, called a 'gamme', is built with domed wooden beams and covered over with turf. A hole in the roof allows smoke from the fire to escape.
- C.** The Sámi are best known for reindeer herding. Reindeer meat, is used for cooking, leather and fur is used to make shoes and clothing, and antlers and bones make useful tools and decorative objects. Reindeer are so important to the Sámi way of life, that many people go to a special university to learn how to care for their animals. Like we might have classes in Maths or English, they have classes that teach them how to look after the reindeer herds.
- D.** There are nine different Sámi languages. A total of nine different but closely related Sami languages are spoken in the Sámi region. Today, three of these languages are in active use in Northern Norway. Sámi people from the south of Northern Norway can talk effortlessly to their nearest Sámi neighbours in Sweden, but cannot communicate with Sámi people from the far north. Thankfully, the word 'reindeer' is the same for all Sámi people, meaning they can communicate with each other about reindeer, no matter what language they're speaking.
- E.** The Sámi are 'semi-nomadic', meaning they don't stay in the same place all year. Sámi herders migrate with their reindeer during the seasons, heading to the mountains for winter and coming back together with the community in the summer. On the journey Sámi herders will camp in a traditional tent, called a 'lavvo'. A lavvo is a circular frame of poles leaning inwards towards a pointy top – similar in style to the teepees or wigwams used by the indigenous people of America.
- F.** In the twenty-first century, Sámi culture is meeting the modern world in a new way. No Sámi people live a completely traditional life today, and the everyday lives of many of these indigenous people appear very modern indeed. At the same time, however, interest in joik, duodji and the language itself is increasing rapidly. The Sámi National Theatre Beaivas, rich production of literature, Sámi media and broadcasting are all using the Sámi language in new for a. This indicates that there is a hope for the language and culture.

Monchy Primary School in St Lucia

Welcome to Monchy Primary School in St Lucia! This cool school is situated in Gros-Islet, towards the north side of the island. It opened in 1951, and teaches 192 pupils between the ages of 4-14, split across 11 classes. It's the start of a new school year here, so there's excitement in the air for another year of learning and discovery!

Principal, Jane Jacob-Jean - who attended this school when she was a child - kindly takes us on a tour of Monchy Primary School. This Eastern Caribbean island reaches average temperatures of 31°C and above from mid-August to the end of October, so the classrooms at Monchy Primary School are bright and airy, with big windows. Some classes are even held outside!

The buildings are brightly coloured and decorated, with colourful posters and paintings on the walls that display the trees and fruits native to the island, like bananas! Bananas play a huge part in the economy of St Lucia, as they are the country's biggest export, and many adults go on to work in banana production here. Healthy eating is an important topic at Monchy Primary School.

Many children that go to school here are from poor backgrounds, and so school is a place for them to learn and eat a good, healthy meal. There's a lunch programme, supported by the Ministry of Education in St Lucia. Working with the St Lucian Ministry of Agriculture, pupils learn how to grow their own vegetables, such as lettuces, in a greenhouse on site - amazing! The school kids here say that getting to eating breakfast with their friends before class is one of the reasons they love coming to school!

The school day in St Lucia may be much longer than what you're used to! For many kids, the day begins at 7.30 am and ends at 5 pm - check out the school timetable below.

7,30 am - 8:45 am: Breakfast club!

9 30 am: The bell signals the start of the school day.

10,15 am – 10,30 am: School assembly! The whole school meets on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays to hear announcements and pray together. On Tuesdays and Thursdays, class prayer time replaces assembly.

10.30 am: Break time! Children play games including their own version of football and traditional St Lucian games such as 'Boom Chest' – where kids throw small objects, such as shells, into the air and try to bounce them off their chest!

10.45 am: Language classes – children study English and literacy.

12 pm: Lunch!

Afternoon: More lessons! ICT, PE, Music and French classes take place in the afternoon, sometimes outside, under the shade of the trees.

3 pm - 4 pm: After school club! Pupils can stay after school to take part in extra activities, such as the community orchestra, where they learn songs to perform for tourists and staff at the hotel, as a thank you for the breakfast club.

4 pm. – 5 pm. - Homework club! To make sure everyone gets home safely, school finishes at 5 pm so there is still time for kids to make their way home during daylight hours.

The school plays a really important part in the local community. Without the school, wouldn't have access to healthy food, or anyone to look after them and keep them safe while their parents are at work. The school library and the computer lab are open to and enjoyed by the whole community, not just the pupils.
